Subject:	Draft Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Council Framework Decision 2004/757/JHA in order to include new psychoactive substances in the definition of 'drugs' and repealing Council Decision 2005/387/JHA of the Council (First reading) - Adoption of the Council's position at first reading and of the statement of the Council's reasons

1. On 17 September 2013 the Commission sent the above proposal¹, based on Article 83(1) TFEU²³⁴, to the Council.
2. The European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on 17 April 2014⁵.

3. At its 3552th meeting on 20 June 2017, the General Affairs Council reached a political agreement on the Council's position at first reading on the above Directive¹.
4. The Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to suggest that the Council:
 - adopt the Council's position at first reading, as set out in 10537/17 and the statement of reasons as set out in 10537/17 ADD 1, as an 'A' item at a forthcoming meeting, with the Austrian delegation voting against;
 - order that the statements in the addendum to this note be entered in the minutes of that meeting.
